Environment Day






Father's Day


The Green Day celebration was not just an educational event but also a blissful occasion that left a lasting impression on the children, fostering a love for nature and a deeper understanding of the world around them.


Fresher's Day




Celebrating Incredible India



The special assembly is an experience and an opportunity to educate students about unity, traditions and values associated with these festivals.


Hindi Literary Week


